


Library Fund 2021-22: LED Lighting in the Stacks

I hank you to everyone who donated to this year's Library Fund, which raised money from our members to install a modern lighting system in the stacks. The new system will have several benefits, contributing to a reduction in the Library's environmental footprint, energy and money savings, protect books from heat damage and be much easier to use. Donations of all sizes from £5 to £5,000, as well as Gift Aid, played an important role. Thanks to your support, a total of **£87,000** has been raised, which should make it possible for us to light the entirety of the Back Stacks and the St. James's Building.

James Bartos: The Ornamental Wilderness in the English Garden

We are delighted to announce that Library supporter James Bartos has recently published a new book, available now from Unicorn Publishing Group.

The Ornamental Wilderness in the English Garden reinterprets the English formal garden of the late seventeenth and early eighteenth centuries through the perspective of a typical feature of those gardens, the ornamental grove, called a wilderness. In its mature form, the wilderness constituted most of the garden, shady and private, a place for retreat as well as social activity, with a seeming naturalness achieved through artifice, where cultural incident and nature were equally appreciated. A copy of *The Ornamental Wilderness in the English Garden* has recently been added to the Library's collection and can be seen on display in the

Mason's Yard window (pictured above).

Director's Drinks

We had a lively discussion at the recent Director's Drinks, where supporters joined Library Director, Philip Marshall, in the Reading Room, to hear about the Library's plans for the future and updates from the past year.

Supporters heard how, despite the pandemic, the Library's membership had grown again in 2021/22, the fourth year in a row, taking the total number of members to well over 7,300. Growth was particularly strong in our Young Persons Membership category, increasing by 30% in this year and now comprising more than 10% of our membership. Philanthropic support for free and subsidised membership for Emerging Writers and state schools, has also widened access to the Library.

The Director also explained how the Tom Stoppard Innovation Fund is being used to make vital improvements to the Library's systems. The Fund was raised through an appeal in 2017/18 to celebrate and commemorate the end of Sir Tom Stoppard's 15-

year term as Library President. The Fund was set up to give the Library the space, opportunity and time to explore and introduce new ideas and technologies that would best support its members and the journey to financial sustainability. Having already supported the introduction of a new Library Management System, the Fund is being used for the completion of the Library's long outstanding retro-cataloguing project and is also funding the introduction of a new Customer Relationship Management (CRM) system later this year.

Supporters were warmly thanked for their generous donations that allow the Library to keep providing inspiration and support to readers and writers of all different kinds.

Archives

Our Library Archivist, Nathalie Belkin has been steadily working through an archive of letters from notable members and membership materials in order to preserve these and keep them safe. As part of this ongoing project, we are working with University College London looking at earlier borrowing records which not only hold academic interest, but opportunities for Library publicity following interesting discoveries.
